

Style differences between the Australian Government *Style manual* and AMOS

AMOS and the Australian Government *Style manual* (published online in 2020) have many overlaps in content and recommendations, although AMOS is broader in scope.

In areas covered by both manuals, some style recommendations differ. The table below shows the main differences as at October 2022. (Note that both style manuals are online resources and so may be amended at any time.)

Punctuation: en dash (year spans)	 Avoid en dashes in spans of years. Write the years out in full. The exception is for date ranges for: financial years information in parentheses, such as terms of office and years of birth and death. Examples: the 2020–21 financial year Sidney Nolan (1917–1992) had 3 younger siblings Australia's prime minister at the start of the Depression was James Scullin (1929–1932) Caroline Chisholm (1808–1877) 	 Use en dashes and abbreviated date ranges. Examples: the 2020-21 financial year Sidney Nolan (1917-92) had 3 younger siblings Australia's prime minister at the start of the Depression was James Scullin (1929-32) Caroline Chisholm (1808-77)
Punctuation: en dash (minus sign)	Don't use an en dash instead of a minus sign. Screen readers will read dashes as dashes, not as the minus sign.	It is acceptable to use an en dash (but not a hyphen) to represent the minus sign; however, be aware that some screen readers do not read en dashes or minus signs correctly

Numbers	Use numerals for '2' and above. Write the numbers 'zero' and 'one' in words	Use numerals for all numbers, including '1' and '0'. An exception is when 'one' is acting as an indefinite article

Capitals	Don't use an initial capital at the start of sentences when the trade mark or brand starts with a lower case letter.	Capitalise these names at the start of a sentence, or rewrite the sentence so that the shortened form does not appear at the beginning.

Plants and animals	When there are several genera that start with the same letter, include the second letter in the abbreviation. Example:	If there is any chance of ambiguity for the genus name, write it out in full. Example:
	 Anopterus macleayanus and Aleuries moluccana are small Australian trees. Although An. macleayanua is found in cool places, Al. moluccana can tolerate tropical conditions. 	 Anopterus macleayanus and Aleuries moluccana are small Australian trees. Anopterus glandulosus is a shrub that is endemic to Tasmania. [Not A. glandulosus or An. glandulosus]
Currencies	Don't place a space between the IBAN currency code and the numerals. Example:	Use a nonbreaking space between the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) 3-letter code and the amount.
	 Minimum wages are currently: Australia - AUD19.49 per hour Thailand - THB313.00 per day 	Example: • Minimum wages are currently: - Australia – AUD 19.49 per hour - Thailand – THB 313.00 per day [Note: Currency codes are assigned by the ISO; IBAN stands for International Bank Account

Disease names	 When referring to an eponym in writing, use the following rules: If it is a disease named after people who suffered from it, use the possessive case. If it is a disease or anatomical part named after the person who discovered, studied or described it, don't use the possessive case. Examples: Lou Gehrig's disease [Named after Lou Gehrig, a high-profile sufferer of the disease] Alzheimer disease [Named after Dr Alois Alzheimer, who first described the disease] 	Do not use the possessive for eponymic names of human diseases. Examples: • Lou Gehrig disease • Alzheimer disease
References: in-text citations	 Use the word 'and' between names outside and inside parentheses. Don't use the ampersand ('&'). Example: Other researchers reported similar results (Black and Jones 2017). 	Use an ampersand.Example:Other researchers reported similar results (Black & Jones 2017).
	 When citing multiple works in the same in-text citation, use semicolons between citations. Enclose all the citations in one set of parentheses. Example: Other researchers reported similar results (White and Jones 2017; Black 2018; Abaza 2019). 	 Use commas between citations. Example: Other researchers reported similar results (White & Jones 2017, Black 2018, Abaza 2019).
	 When citing multiple works by the same author in the same year, put a letter after the date of each citation. Put an 'a' after the date of the first work you cite, then a 'b' after the date of the second, and so on. Example: She has written extensively on Australia – New Zealand relations (Dobell 2018a, 2018b). 	List the references as a, b, c and so on, with no spaces or commas. Example: • She has written extensively on Australia – New Zealand relations (Dobell 2018ab).
